

The Pacific Climate Change Film Festival is open to all films (animation, documentaries, music videos, short commentaries, etc.) that highlight climate change issues within the Pacific.

The Festival is part of the 'Pacific Climate Change Film Project' an innovative partnership between the Secretariat of the Pacific Regional Environment Programme

(SPREP) and the British High Commission, Suva to share stories about how Pacific communities are responding to climate change.

The 'Pacific Climate Change Film Project' will train and support media professionals, filmmakers and producers from the Pacific to produce their own films on how climate

change is affecting their countries. The stories will not only focus on climate change issues, but also share experiences about what is being done throughout the region to reduce its impacts.

The Project will culminate in the Pacific's first climate change film festival in Fiji in August 2008.

Films to be in **DVD** (PAL or NTSC) format complete with English commentary or in the original version with English subtitles.

## Length

We are accepting films of **ANY** length.

## Entry fees

There are **NO** entry fees for submitting films.

## Closing date for entries

SPREP must receive the completed entry forms together with the film on DVD (PAL or NTSC) by **1 July 2008**. A separate entry form must be sent with each film submitted.

The submitted films will not be returned to the entrants unless a stamped, self-addressed envelope is included for return.

The Film Festival is a not-for-profit initiative coordinated by SPREP with funding from the British High Commission, Suva.
