I hope this PACC Snapshot reaches you in the best of health and that the PACC project implementation is progressing well. With this communication, the RPMU would like to follow up on a few key undertakings (reporting) and also inform on key activities that we need to be cognizant off in this quarter.



### 2012 Annual Work Plan

Two weeks ago, I had sent out a request that we need to develop our 2012 AWP. There is a reason for that as the RPMU will need to submit our consolidated AWP to the next PACC Board Meeting scheduled for November 2011.



At present, only 3 - 2012 AWP had been received and they are currently being reviewed. The AWP are from; 1. Palau, 2. Cook Islands, and 3. Tuvalu. We hope we can receive the rest by the 5<sup>th</sup> of October so that it does not interfere with the quarterly reporting.



### Quarterly Reporting

We are at the end of the 3<sup>rd</sup> quarter yesterday and we need your 4<sup>th</sup> quarter reports (narrative, QWP, ICE and FFs). We hope that could come forth soonest so that we can finalize and submit to UNDP accordingly. We have completed our 2<sup>nd</sup> MPR for the PACC project (8<sup>th</sup> - 12<sup>th</sup> of August 2011 in Vanuatu). It was a successful one and there were some great outcomes that we were able to agree on to improve the project. UNDP and SPREP were supposed to get back to you with some progress on action items they were responsible for. I would like to inform you all that discussion/negotiation is being carried out at the highest level of UNDP on some of the key action items. Once UNDP communicates to the RPMU the outcomes of the discussions they are having with their HQ, it will be relayed to you all in due time.

## “Writeshop”



The RPMU communicated to you some time ago a “Writeshop” initiative to be held in Fiji on the 10-14<sup>th</sup> of October 2011. You were encouraged to put in papers for the “Writeshop” so that you could be assisted to develop the paper and if it could feature in a peer-reviewed journal or the *Tiempo*, it would help build your confidence in writing technical papers.

I would like to inform that only Tuvalu (Ms Loia Tausi) will be participating and her abstract has been approved by the Coordinating Team. A Red Cross personal (Reboama) from Cook Islands will also be participating and he is also involved with the PACC project. Red Cross is a PACC partner in the Cooks and his writing is based on the work in Mangaia.

## Technical Review and Assistance for the Demonstration Component of the UNDP/GEF/PACC project.

Further to the MTR reported above, there will also be a Technical Review to be carried out around November 2011. Results from the review will inform

the design to up-scale PACC (also known as PACC+) work across the region using the AusAid financing of \$7.8m. The Technical Review TOR will be shared with you shortly.

The RPMU will be in touch shortly on the schedule the consultants will be taking for your information and preparation at the national level.

## Cost Benefit Analysis Sub-Regional Training for the Water Sector

At the 2nd MPR we all acknowledged the need to strengthen economic elements of the PACC. This includes cost-benefit analyses of pilot demonstration projects as well as broader sector level and national level economic analyses of adaptation to climate change. One of the key reasons why this economics work is needed is to ensure that PICs can develop evidence-based policy and project proposals needed to access 'donor' climate-change financing.

For the water sub-regional cost-benefit workshop, this will be held in Nauru between the 2nd to the 6th of November, 2011. We hope you have communicated the names of those who will be participating yesterday (meaning it is overdue). So please submit by early next week if you have not done so.
