Reporting arrangements:

When reporting for 1st quarter 2012 is due before end of March, all Coordinators should submit their near final draft reports to their SPREP PACC contacts [copying Peni and self]. I say near final because quality checks and inputs from your team members should already be undertaken. Your SPREP contacts will review the reports and make recommendations particularly on results oriented reporting. Face Forms, Quarterly Work Plans (QWP) and Itemized Cost Estimate (ICE) will also be reviewed.

When all is agreed, then the SPREP PACC Contacts will then submit to Peni a short paragraph on what is/are tangible results that each country has achieved on a particular quarter (narrative) with the reviewed FFs, QWPs and ICE.

Peni will then collate all submissions and submit a final draft to UNDP (see table on quarterly reporting for details).
