

WCPA

- The IUCN World Commission on Protected Areas is one of six Commissions of the leading conservation body in the world - the International Union for the Conservation of Nature (IUCN)
- WCPA is the leading global knowledge network of protected area specialists with 2500 individuals from over 140 countries.
- WCPA works closely with IUCN Global Programme on Protected Areas (GPAP)
- 'Oceania' is Australia, New Zealand and the Pacific Islands
- 360 plus members



Key international driver: CBD 2020 Aichi Targets

Target 11: By 2020, at least 17 per cent of terrestrial and inland water, and 10 per cent of coastal and marine areas, especially areas of particular importance for biodiversity and ecosystem services, are conserved through effectively and equitably managed, ecologically representative and well connected systems of protected areas and other effective area-based conservation measures, and integrated into the wider landscape and seascapes.

Scaling up & building networks of PAs


- Expansion of PAs esp. marine -19m sq.km ocean, 13% territorial waters, 30% target endorsed at WCC
- Expansion to meet <u>all</u> Target 11 components
- Protect the high seas
- Avoidance of regression or category slide





Conservation in the right place - Key Biodiversity Areas are...

- Sites that contribute significantly to the global persistence of biodiversity
- Scope: genetic, species and ecosystem level, across taxonomic groups, in terrestrial, freshwater and marine realms
- Sites with delineated boundaries
- Not necessarily protected areas
- Being developed in Australia IUCN, BA, WWF and WCS








Effective Management - MEA + Green List

- Independently assured evaluation procedure

- Initiatives like the World Heritage Outlook Reports help focus on best practice




Connectivity - sites to systems of protected and other conserved areas

- AT 11 '<u>well-connected systems</u> of protected areas and other effective area-based conservation measures, <u>integrated into the wider landscape and seascape</u>'
- Strong science base in conservation biology
- Critical for climate change adaptation
- WCPA has long history of championing 'Connectivity conservation'powerhouse of **inclusive innovation**
- Formal PAs, IPAs and OECMs including voluntary and ancillary conservation
- SGs on PPAs/ CC and TF on OECMs to provide guidance to CBD Parties

A promising future

The beauty and diversity of nature are only rivalled by the richness and variety of ways by which people collaborate to care for it, as inseparable from their own wellbeing. Yet, we appear to fall very short of our collective responsibility towards nature and our shared humanity. There is an immense *unrealised* potential to strengthen conservation, support sustainable livelihoods and meet human rights. We can begin to respond by improving our ways of taking decisions for the conservation of nature and its associated cultural diversity and values.
