Vanuatu Project Summary

THE ISSUE

Waste received at the main landfill in Vanuatu comprises 35% beverage containers, which are also seen as litter and in dumpsites or burnt in pits.

Vanuatu is highly vulnerable to natural disasters, but lacks resources and infrastructure to safely and effectively manage the waste caused by these events.

THE SOLUTION

Vanuatu have focused their PacWastePlus investment to support:

- the implementation of the Product Stewardship Scheme to enable long-term, self-financing collection and recovery of recyclable items.
- resources and infrastructure to effectively manage and respond to disaster events

PROJECT OBJECTIVES

- 1. Legislative environment for the long-term operation of the Product Stewardship Scheme
- 2. Increase the capacity to safely and efficiently manage waste produced from disaster events
- 3. Households and communities understanding the benefits and participating in of improved waste management

Strengthened government capacity to develop Vanuatu's concept for a Product Stewardship Scheme through stakeholder engagement, planning, economic modelling, and legislative drafting. Supported asbestos risk management by contributing to the development of the National Hazardous Waste Bill, integrating asbestos controls into the building code, and developing an Asbestos Management Code of Practice. In response to disasters in 2019 and 2024, enhanced national disaster waste management response, and built community capacity through, clean-up, and community planning and training; improving resilience to future disasters.

Our PacWastePlus project supported us to both design our sustainable financing scheme, and support us in our response to natural disaster events. We are thankful for their experience from across the Pacific to help us find long-term solutions for our context
