# Terminal Report Associate Turtle Database Officer

# **Purpose**

The purpose of this report to provide an account of activities undertaken by the Associate Turtle Database Officer over the six-year contract period ( $1^{st}$  March 2004 –  $1^{st}$  March 2010) at SPREP as well as provide handover information for the in-coming Associate Turtle Database Officer.

# **Background**

The duties of Associate Turtle Database Officer (ATDO) were as follows;

- ➤ Plan, oversee and facilitate the activities in maintaining the Regional Marine Turtle Database under the Regional Marine Turtle Conservation Programme (RMTCP). This will include:
  - Development and implementation of an annual work plan and budget and associated reporting requirements consistent in updating, maintaining and reporting on the regional marine turtle database under the RMTCP strategy;
  - Regional turtle database network co-ordination which provides for turtle database services, tagging programme, information exchange, regional and international cooperation, training opportunities and securing of resources to implement the programme;
  - Assist in implementation of in-country turtle data management initiatives in partnership with RMTCP network members (government and non-government agencies);
  - Development of education and awareness resources; and
  - Facilitating the database review process, including input into regional workshops.
- ➤ Ensure effective linkages are made with other SPREP programmes and initiatives, particularly the Coastal Management Programme and Coral Reef and Wetland Programme;
- Assist with initiatives as required within SPREP's Biodiversity and Natural Resource Conservation Programme; and
- > Other relevant activities as required.

Furthermore, the duties of the ATDO are further guided by the marine turtle conservation priorities identified by SPREP Member countries and territories in the 2003 - 2007 Marine Turtle Action Plan (MTAP) and the 2008 - 2012 MTAP. The specific actions for the turtle database in the 2003 - 2007 and 2008 - 2012 MTAPs are as follows;

## 1. Marine Turtle Action Plan 2003 - 2007

#### **Regional Turtle Databases**

This action has been given a very high priority. Urgent need to upgrade and regularly update the SPREP RMTCP database, as new information is available to maintain its relevance.

- Continue updating (a) tagging and knowledge databases, and look for areas where improvements are needed for database operation and services, including deficiencies noted in general running of the database.
- Where possible, provide assistance to RMTCP members for turtle conservation work as it relates to the database operation services.
- Continue to work with other database programmes such as those operated by Dr. Colin Limpus (QEDH), George Balazs (NMFS), SPC, and regional consultants.
  - 1. Complete update of nesting component of database.
  - 2. To be involved with Arnavons Solomon Islands turtle monitoring work as a case study to review, assess and propose improvements to the tag database.
  - 3. Proposed visit to Dr. Limpus' turtle research programme (QEDH) to look at potential improvements in database design and use.
  - 4. Look at possibility of running database on Access as this is becoming the standard database software in SPREP.
  - 5. Complete database manual.
  - 6. Monthly meetings with Turtle Project Officer to discuss progress of turtle work in reporting and database.
  - 7. Produce 2003 Turtle Annual Report of turtle tagging database.
  - 8. Member countries to have direct access to SPREP turtle database via Internet.
- SPREP to ensure long-term commitment to database, and link up this database with national databases
- Database to link up to appropriate GIS.
- SPREP to extend database to catch landings, etc
- Encourage member countries to supply tag data by 31 August 2003.
- Form working group to standardize data fields and distribute to member countries for their input to database – 31 May 2003
  - Auckland University and/or other institutions to develop genetic database for archiving
     by 31 October 2003

# 2. Marine Turtle Action Plan 2008-2012

# **Theme 8: Turtle Database**

#### Objective

Implement the Turtle Research and Monitoring Database System (TREDS) in SPREP member countries and territories.

#### Actions

- 1. Develop Information and Data Sharing Policy and Protocol for TREDS:
  - In place and used effectively by 2008;
  - Policy and protocol to include restrictions on data access and sharing data with communities;
  - Members to adopt agreed upon policy and protocol at SPREP meeting in 2008;
  - Distribute adopted policy and protocol to members.

- 2. TREDS is distributed to all members by early 2008 with in-country training and follow-up for use and report generation.
- 3. All members are encouraged to use TREDS in accordance with the adopted policy and protocols.
- 4. Members to submit data annually to TREDS Database Officer.
- 5. Reporting:
  - Members report to SPREP at least annually on tagging records and activities, noting that tag reissue will be dependent on reporting;
  - Report recovered tags immediately to SPREP using appropriate form (where available) or providing standard information. Provide reward (such as a t-shirt, poster, etc.) for recovered tags;
  - SPREP to report annually to members on tags distributed and recovered results of mapping, and other significant data.
- 6. Institutional commitment:
  - SPREP commits to long-term maintenance of the TREDS programme;
  - Seek long-term funding from members and partners (including NGOs, IGOs and the private sector) to maintain TREDS Officer and programme.
- 7. Distribute tags and applicators to members undertaking tagging activities and engaged in SPREP approved tagging programme.
- 8. Link to other databases that contain marine turtle data.

#### Indicators

- All members effectively using TREDS and reporting annually to SPREP.
- SPREP produce five annual reports of summary data.
- Increased return of tags and reporting of tagging information.
- Information from TREDS used to provide a picture of turtle distribution and migration at the regional level.
- TREDS programme, including responsible officer, secured for the long term.
- Link to other relevant turtle databases completed.

# **Funding support**

The ATDO position and operational budget were fully funded under financial support from the Western Pacific Regional Fishery Management Council based in Hawaii, USA.

The ATDO was also able to secure funding for tagging equipment and awareness materials from the Taiwan-Republic of China funding through Pacific Islands Forum, the New England Aquarium Marine Conservation Action Funding (MCAF), the Pacific Development and Conservation Trust (PCDT) administered through the New Zealand Department of Internal Affairs, the Western Pacific Regional Fishery Management Council (WPRFMC), and additional funding made available through SPREP.

# **Turtle Research and Monitoring Database System (TREDS)**

#### 1. TREDS Background

The SPREP Regional Marine Turtle Conservation Programme started in 1990 with financial support from the Canadian Government. The main objective of this programme was to establish a regional marine turtle database for PICTs conducting turtle conservation activities.

In 1993, a regional database was established using expertise from the Queensland Department of Environment and Heritage in Australia. This regional database was officially transferred to SPREP in 1994, and the current system is largely based on this previous initiative, but now using Microsoft $_{\odot}$  ACCESS as its operating platform.

In the 2003-2007 Marine Turtle Action Plan (MTAP), PICT members tasked the SPREP secretariat to coordinate the upgrade and update of the regional marine turtle database and assist members with database operational services. Furthermore, Theme 8 of the current 2008-2012 MTAP identifies various actions to be carried out by both the SPREP members and the secretariat to ensure wide implementation of TREDS in the region.

From 2003 to date, the development and implementation of TREDS has been financially supported by the Western Pacific Regional Fishery Management Council (WPRFMC). Other partners have included the South-East Asia Fisheries Development Centre (SEAFDEC), the Secretariat of the Pacific Community (SPC), the Queensland Department of Environment and Resource Management, the US National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA) - National Marine Fisheries Service (NMFS), and the Marine Research Foundation.

TREDS was officially launched on the 17<sup>th</sup> February 2009 at the 29th Annual Symposium on Sea Turtle Biology and Conservation in Brisbane, Australia.

#### 2. TREDS Development

The development (programming in Microsoft ACCESS) of the current version of TREDS has been the collective contribution of the SPC Oceanic Fisheries Programme – Peter William and Colin Millar, JP Alexander, Dr. Nick Pilcher, Bogdan Zamfir, SPREP DSA – Christian Slaven. The ATDO has provided input into development through testing the system, logging and reporting errors and providing suggestions to improve the functionality and usability of the system. #### 3. Information in TREDS

The most current version of TREDS is Version 4.0 (released on 24<sup>th</sup> September 2009) and can be downloaded at <a href="http://www.sprep.org/treds/TREDSnews.aspx">http://www.sprep.org/treds/TREDSnews.aspx</a>. The development of TREDS is an ongoing effort and the setup files are updated regularly at the above website address.

A total of 50058 tags are recorded in TREDS as being distributed to SPREP PICTs since the start of the Turtle tagging programme and of these only 11802 (23.5%) are recorded in TREDs as being reported back to SPREP and included in TREDS (table 1). Tags distributed by other agencies such as the US NOAA National Fisheries Wildlife Service and the Queensland Turtle Research Project for use in the SPREP member PICTs have also been recorded in TREDS. A total of 3535 non-SPREP tags are recorded in TREDS as being used in PICTs.

A total of 9842 turtles are recorded in TREDS as being tagged in the SPREP PICTs region (table 2). Of the number of turtle recorded in TREDS, 470 turtles have been reported to SPREP as tag recoveries. For further information please refer to the TREDS Annual Report 2009 (in publication) which documents and summarises all information held in TREDS for the SPREP region since the start of the Turtle tagging programme. More tagging equipment is needed for the SPREP region as other tagging projects such as the Queensland Turtle Research Project have shown that long term tagging projects can provide much needed information for the conservation and management of marine turtles.

# **In-country TREDS implementation**

The implementation of TREDS within SPREP members PICTs is dependent on the lead agency in turtle conservation in each PICT. Training on TREDS was provided for American Samoa, Fiji, French Polynesia, Kiribati, Samoa, Solomon Islands, Tonga, Tuvalu and Vanuatu. For those PICTS not visited by the ATDO, assistance in the use of TREDS was provided via telephone, email and SKYPE. A TREDS Country Report has been prepared and distributed to all SPREP member PICTs that have data held in the master TREDS housed at SPREP<sup>1</sup>.

The in-coming ATDO should follow up with the contacts for TREDS in each of the PICTs on progress of TREDS as staff responsible for TREDS change over time and further in-country training may be needed. TREDS has been installed and is in use in the following countries and territories;

## Awareness and education materials

## • Tag wanted Posters

Funding received from the PDCT, MCAF and the WPRFMC were used to reproduce the 'Tags Wanted' in Marshallese, French, English, Solomon Islands pidgin, Ni Vanuatu Bislama, Papua New Guinea pidgin for distribution to assist with tag recovery reporting.

## • 2006 Year of the Sea Turtle campaign materials

Funding received from the Taiwan/Republic of China Annual Contribution 2003/2004 was used to contract an Education Consultant to work with the Education and Social Communications Officer to develop materials to support the education and communications activities for the 2006 Pacific Year of the Sea Turtle Campaign. These activities included the following;

a. 2006 Pacific Year of the Sea Turtle logo and slogan



The slogan for the campaign was "Turtles: Protect Them, Protect our Heritage. The campaign slogan and logo depict the fact that marine turtles are a part of the Pacific people's heritage, and conserving them is ensuring the survival of the heritage. The target audiences for the campaign included local communities, legislators and policy makers, commercial fishers and regional partners. The campaign was launched on the 1<sup>st</sup> March 2006 and ended on the 13th March 2007.

#### b. Development of campaign materials

The campaign logo and slogan were used in all SPREP external correspondence and publications during 2006, printed on t-shirts, postcards, Christmas cards, ANZ/SPREP bluebag initiative, 2006 Year of the Sea Turtle Campaign posters, media, stickers, fact sheets, ambassador tags and newsletters. The logo was also distributed to SPREP members and partners to display in any promotional materials the developed for the 2006 Year of the Sea Turtle Campaign

# **Tagging equipment**

Since the start of the ATDO's tenure at SPREP proposals were submitted to and funding received from Taiwan-ROC funding through Pacific Islands Forum, the New England Aquarium MCAF, the PDCT administered through the New Zealand Department of Internal Affairs, the WPRFMC, and additional funding made available through SPREP. Initially, only titanium tags were purchased for the Regional turtle tagging programme but some of PICTS were a bit reluctant to apply the large titanium tags to juvenile and sub-adult sized turtles so the ATDO consulted with technical advisers to the SPREP Marine Turtle Conservation Programme (Dr. Colin Limpus and George Balazs) and decided to purchase also the smaller inconel tags to be used on smaller sized turtles. The tags series and tag applicators purchased within the six years of the ATDO's contract are as follows in table 3;

The ATDO collated all information on the tags distributed to PICTS prior to her arrival (from tag recoveries, country tagging data, information provided by technical advisers to the SPREP turtle programme and written notes on post-it pads etc.) with the tags distributed within the six year contract period to compile a tag inventory for all tags used in the SPREP region. Tags used in the SPREP region have been supplied by the SPREP Secretariat, Queensland Turtle Research Project lead by Dr. Colin Limpus, the US NOAA National Marine Fisheries Service Marine Turtle Research Program lead by Mr. George Balazs and the French Polynesia Turtle Conservation programme who have purchased their own tags. SPREP tag inventory has been added to the ACCSTR Tag Inventory on <a href="http://accstr.ufl.edu/taginv.html">http://accstr.ufl.edu/taginv.html</a>. Tags and applicators distributed by SPREP and other agencies and contacts details of those to whom tags were distributed as well as well tags reported back to SPREP are listed below in table 4.
